How deep is your love? Though the Bee Gees probably didn't have Valentine's Day in mind when they wrote their schmaltz-rock classic, at this time of year you're pretty much obliged by law to demonstrate the depth of your romantic feelings. So make your own at this year's Print Love-In. Sponsored by the Philadelphia Print Collaborative – a local association aimed at stirring up interest in printmaking – this workshop lets you use silkscreen, letterpress, lithography and other techniques to make cards that express love and reflect your artistic abilities. Working from a variety of romantic images created by local talent specifically for this year's shindig, you're encouraged to experiment with various printing methods to individualize your messages of love. If it all seems a bit daunting, PPC artists Elaine Erne, Sarah Pohlman, Miriam Singer and more will be on hand to help. And for those too intimidated to participate, preprinted cards will be available for \$5 to \$10. They may not come from your heart, but at least they beat Hallmark's manufactured sentimentality.
